A liberal arts college in Poughkeepsie, Vassar was originally founded as a women's college in 1861. This year, Vassar is ranked 28th in the nation. After declining to merge with Yale University, Vassar became one of the first all-women's colleges to go coed in 1969. Sixty percent of freshmen receive school grants, which average nearly \$39,000. Vassar sponsors a number of study abroad programs in locations like Russia, France and Costa Rica. The school offers over 50 majors (English, political science and psychology are among the most popular), plus a self-designed major. The only mandatory requirements for graduation are proficiency in a foreign language, a quantitative course and a firstyear writing course. Vassar's art collection-more than 20,000 works-is one of the oldest college art collections in the country. Each year, around 500 students do field work for academic credit near the school or in New York City. Vassar occupies a 1,000-acre campus in the Hudson Valley region and is home to a 500-acre farm and ecological preserve. Notable alumni include Flickr cofounder Caterina Fake and filmmaker Noah Baumbach. The school's 23 varsity teams compete in Division III athletics.

SUNY, New Paltz is a public college that traces its roots to the New Paltz Classical School. founded in 1828, which taught Greek, Latin, reading, writing and arithmetic. In 1948, it became one of the founding institutions of the State University of New York system. Located at the base of the Catskill Mountains, SUNY, New Paltz offers 105 undergraduate and 50 graduate programs across its six schools. Popular majors include psychology, early childhood and childhood education, and visual arts. The Samuel Dorksy Museum of Art is one of the largest museums in the SUNY system, housing more than 5,000 works of American art and 19th- to -21st-century photography. The campus library is named after Sojourner Truth, an African-American abolitionist and women's rights advocate, who was born in Ulster County, where the college is located. The varsity athletic teams, known as the Hawks, compete in NCAA Division III.

Founded in 1892 as a music conservatory, Ithaca College is a private school that now offers 97 majors and 74 minors for undergrads and 27 majors for graduate students. The school is internationally known for its communications program and has a long list of notable alumni in broadcasting and business, including Disney CEO Bob Iger and ABC World News anchor David Muir. It also has two radio stations, award-winning WICB and online VIC Radio. Ithaca values meaningful teacher-student collaborations and boasts a majority of classes of fewer than 20 students. The 669-acre contemporary campus in the Finger Lakes region sits on a hill with inspiring views of Cayuga Lake, just minutes from scenic waterfalls and gorges. Full-time students can cross-register for courses at neighboring Cornell University. The school operates satellite campuses in London. Los Angeles and New York City, along with a semester in Washington, D.C. program. Nearly 90% of freshmen receive institutional tuition grants, averaging nearly \$20,000. Ithaca's Bombers participate in NCAA Division III athletics.

Students at Syracuse University make a bright spot in the snowy winters of upstate New York by donning the school color of orange at sports games. The No. 64 research university, it was founded by members of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and today it is nonsectarian but affiliated with the United Methodist Church. Syracuse offers more than 200 majors across 13 schools and colleges. The S.I. Newhouse School of Public Communications is ranked among the top communication schools in the nation. The campus is home to a large pool of student media organizations, with a broad range of student-run magazines, radio and TV stations, newspapers, PR and ad agencies. The school recently opened a campus in New York City, where students can spend a semester completing internships and specialized coursework. Approximately 30% of students go Greek by joining one of 75 fraternities and sororities. Nearly 70% of freshmen receive grants from the school, which average \$24,200. Distinguished alumni include Vice President Joe Biden, comic actor Jerry Stiller, and sportscasters Bob Costas and Mike Tirico. The athletic teams compete in NCAA Division I.

Ranked at No. 25 this year, ky League Cornell University was founded in 1865, originally as New York State's land-grant university. Cornell has seven undergraduate colleges, some private, some public, in disciplines ranging from engineering and hotel management to agriculture and liberal arts. The sprawling university offers over 4,000 courses across 100 academic departments, about 80 undergraduate majors and 90 minors. Fifty-four percent of freshmen receive institutional grants averaging \$34,000. Located on a hill above Cayuga Lake in Ithaca, Cornell is known for its picturesque campus, top-notch dining halls and a competitive academic environment. In addition, Cornell has a satellite campus in Qatar and has broken ground on Cornell NYC Tech, a science school in collaboration with Israel's Technion-Israel Institute of Technology. Men's hockey is the most famous of Cornell's Big Red Division I teams, and its library has one of only five copies of the Gettysburg Address handwritten by Abraham Lincoln. Graduates include Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg, authors E.B. White and Toni Morrison, Bill Nye "The Science Guy," and billionaires Sandy Weill and Chuck Feeney.
